

Matching on the log odds of the propensity score also has the advantage that it spreads out the density of very low or very high propensity scores. In a design with a very large sample of comparison cases, Mueser et al. found that in order to assure good matches it was necessary to use much smaller bandwidths at low propensity scores. Use of the log odds allows for a consistent bandwidth to be used. In addition, since the logit is used to predict propensity score, the log odds are a linear combination of the independent variables, and a constant radius is expected to 5 translate into the same metric at different propensity score levels. Although the theory underlying propensity score matching implies that, in the limit as a sample grows, matching on the propensity score also matches on all control variables, in any given application with a finite sample, there is no assurance that matches will be close enough to...
